Gaza was a feint, or diversionary attack"

The letter thought to be written by a nurse at El Arish was said to have been in the contrived documents which later changed this phase of the war.

The guest speaker, Mrs. Stodart spoke of a 5000 pound fund being invested for the future provision of the nurses under control of the Australian Trained Nurses Association (ATNA) Miss Chatfield, President of the ATNA, told the nurses that any military nurse in need of temporary funding could apply to the ATNA. She assured the nurses the matter would be handled confidentially

Mrs. Stodart also made mention of a medal to be given to the nurses by returning soldiers as their own tribute.

Miss Lyons's service is recognised in the Toowong Cemetery, Brisbane, by inclusion in "In their caring hands" by the Friends of the Cemetery Association (Inc.) Version 2h, 25th August 2014, a heritage trail to commemorate the role of nurses, doctors and health professionals.
